The Government has continued to provide financial support to improve physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. It is for schools to decide how the funding is spent. However, schools are to be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding.



In the academic year 2020/21 Barleyhurst Park Primary School was allocated total funding of £17,770 for the academic year. The school did not carry forward any of the allocation from the previous year

This leaves the school with £752.84 to carry forward into next year. This will be used to purchase the Golden Mile package from Premier Sport and some additional resources.

Impact of Funding

- All classes receive at least two weekly high energy PE lesson delivered by a sports coach.
- Staff training delivered by MKSSP to improve teachers' knowledge and understanding of PE. Staff have a better understanding of the new programme of studies that will be implemented next academic year.
- New schemes of work for all units of work in PE to improve delivery and assessment of PE across the school.
- Increased number of pupils leaving KS2 being water confident. At the beginning of school swimming lessons, 47% of the current Year 6 class (14 pupils) were considered water confident. Now, 97% (29 pupils) have achieved at least Water Confidence Level 1, a 50% increase.
- 83% of Year 6 also achieved Water Safety level 1.
- Increased number of pupils leaving KS2 being able to swim 25 metres. 77% of the current Year 6 class have achieved a distance of at least 25 metres. In addition, 7 of these 23 pupils were also able to swim at least 50 metres.
- At the beginning of school swimming lessons, only 47% of the class could swim at least 5-10 metres. Now, 87% of the class can swim at least 10 metres.
- Out of the 16 pupils that were considered non-swimmers at the beginning of school swimming lessons, 75% of those children can now swim a distance of at least 10 metres unaided,
- All pupils experienced different sporting activities during Olympics week, delivered by the sports coach.
