On Monday 11th May, it is the beginning of this year's SATs. All members of the class have worked incredibly hard throughout Year 6 to be ready for these. In preparation for SATs week, please ensure that your child has a calm, relaxed weekend beforehand. Furthermore, please ensure that your child arrives at school on time, each day.



In Maths, we will be completing the final units of the Year 6 curriculum and then we will be revisiting previous learning to revise, consolidate and become more confident with all areas of Maths. In English, we will be continuing to develop our independent writing, when writing narratives and across a range of non-fiction writing. In addition to this, we will continue to develop our SPaG (spelling, punctuation and grammar) knowledge. We will also have weekly Science and Computing lessons. In Science, we will begin learning about living things and their habitats; then, we will learn about evolution and inheritance. In Computing we will be learning about spreadsheets in Excel and getting to grips with using formulas, tables and cells.

The days that pupils will need PE kit will continue to be Monday, Wednesday and Friday.

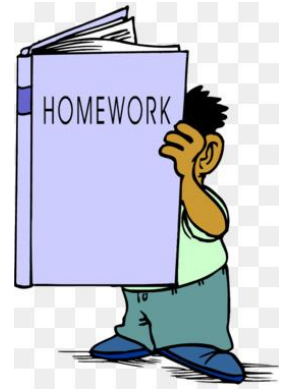
