

This half term we are continuing with our topic about animals.

In **English** we have started with the story '**Dear Zoo**' and will try our best to write a sequel to this story and create our own lift-the-flap books. We will be also going to focus on **SPaG** (different types of sentences, adjectives,

Our next story will be the fairy tale 'Puss in Boots', so we are aiming to complete a range of tasks around the text (role-play, character and setting descriptions etc.). Later in the term, we will explore the collection 'Farmyard Hullabaloo' and have a go at performing and writing similar animal poems/rhymes.

In Maths, we will revise the previous units (numbers to 100, fractions and time) and we will be learning about money, mass, volume, capacity, space, position and direction.

In **Science** we continue with our topic 'Animals, including Humans' and we will focus on describing, comparing and sorting the animals according to their structure and other characteristics. We will also learn about the parts of the human body and associate them with the five senses.

In **Geography** we are going to focus on our local area and fieldwork. We will identify and name the types of houses, jobs and changes we can make to our community.

In **Music** we will be singing a range of songs and will try to compose a simple tune using three or four notes. Our Composer of the term is 'Ed Sheeran'.

How can you help your child?

Reading:

- Encourage your child to revise all the sounds they have been learning. (check the given mat)
- Support your child to read at least three times/week (if possible, the Monster Phonics books) or other books that they might be interested in (age appropriate).
- Ask your child questions about the book they are reading to develop their comprehension.
- Please sign or write a brief comment in the reading record.

Maths:

- Help your child to practise counting in 1s, 2s, 5s and 10s (forwards and backwards within 100).
- Support them to practise the 2, 5 and 10 times tables.
- Encourage them to double any number to 10 and halve even numbers within 20.
- Telling the time to an hour and half past an hour.
- Money recognition (British coins and notes).

Spelling:

Encourage the children to practise the new and previous spellings.

Weekly routines

• PE is on Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays.



Please ensure that the children come into school wearing their PE kit on these days. Long hair **must** be tied up and earrings **must** be removed or covered.

- Spellings will be sent home on Friday and the children will be tested on the following Friday.
- The homework is given out each Thursday and is due in by the following Tuesday.
- Please label your child's belongings.
- Please ensure that your child brings a water bottle in daily. (they can have juice for lunch)
