PE and Sport Premium Report 2024-2025



The Government has continued to provide financial support to improve physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools. The funding is ring-fenced and can only be spent on provision of PE and sport in schools. It is for schools to decide how the funding is spent. However, schools are to be held accountable for how they have used the additional funding.

Please see below for information regarding how the PE and Sports Premium funding was spent in the academic year 2024/25. This expenditure has also been supported by the main school budget.

Impact of Funding

- Training and CPD supported inclusive PE curriculum and physical activity provision.
- 90% of Year 6 achieved Water Safety Level 1.
- Increased number of pupils being able to swim 25 metres. 87% of Year 6 achieved a distance of at least 25 metres.
- 90% of Year 6 pupil being able to use a range of strokes effectively (front crawl, backstroke and breaststroke).
- New equipment was purchased such as new netball equipment and equipment for gymnastics to ensure that pupils had adequate equipment to use during their PE lessons.
- All Year 6 pupils were given the opportunity to represent the school, at least once, in a sporting fixture/festival.
- Pupils across Key Stage 2 including disadvantaged pupils were able to represent the school in competitions/festivals/fixtures for events such as cross country, netball, football, basketball, dodgeball, badminton, korfball and outdoor athletics.
- An increase in pupils' physical activity levels.
