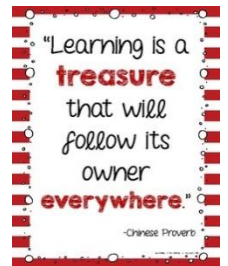

Our Learning

In **English**, we will be reading stories about pirates and information books, investigating amazing sea rescues and we'll be writing postcards, letters, stories, and poetry influenced by the sea. The text we are going to focus on is all about 'Grace Darling', followed by a number of fictional texts such as 'The Pirates Next Door' written by Jonny Duddle and many more.

In **Maths**, we will be learning about temperature, picture graphs, money and 2D shapes. But we will be having a big focus on word problems and how to apply their knowledge when it comes to solving them. As mentioned in parent consultations, it is very important that children learn to read and understand word problems. They may have to solve more than one-step problems and decide which of the four operations are needed to find out the answer. If you would like examples, please do not hesitate to come and see me.

In **Science**, our scientific thinking and science skills will help us to understand how boats float! We will be investigating different materials and their properties, but also what they are used for. We may even test out materials to choose the best ones to use for making our own ships/boats!



Weekly Routines

Our PE sessions this term are on Mondays Tuesdays and Fridays. Please make sure the Giraffes come to school wearing the correct PE kit (short or long sleeves and shorts or jogging bottoms/leggings, depending on weather conditions), long hair must be tied up and earrings must be removed or covered with micropore tape before arriving to school. We will also be having Golden Mile on Mondays and Fridays, but normal uniform should be worn on these days.

Spellings will be sent home on Fridays and the children will be tested on the following Friday.

Homework is set on a Thursday and is due in by the following Tuesday.

How can you help your child?

- Listen to them read each day. There will be a reading book and library book in their book-bag each week. When they do read to you, please make a note in their reading record (this can be your signature or a short comment).
- Ask them questions about what they have read.
- Encourage them to practise their spellings every day, using the 'LOOK, COVER, WRITE, CHECK' method.
- Support them in completing their homework.
- Ensure they have their school library book ready to change every Wednesday please.
- Ensure your child wears their PE kit on the days they have PE lessons.
- Provide a named water bottle for them to use in class. These can be purchased from the school office.

- Friday 10th February - Last day of the half term.
